


A WALK IN THE PARK





GOD'S CARE NOT A MYTH

In Greek mythology the myth of Icarus teaches a lesson about humans who attempt to exceed the boundaries of their abilities and who tempt fate."

Is Jesus Christ familiar with the Greek's way of writing and explaining the difficulties of life and tendencies of mankind to lose themselves in pleasure and pride? He must be, because He teaches that disaster always follows in the wake of pride. (Proverbs 16:18 "Pride goeth before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall")

In the Greek myth of Icarus, the father and his son are imprisoned in a tower from which there is no escape. Yet the father somehow secures wood to build a frame for wings, and unexplainably has plenty of wax and feathers with which to make wings on the frame. He then uses this wonderful contraption for he and his son to leap from the tower and sail away into freedom.

The father passionately and lovingly informs the son that he must not get too close to the sun because the overpowering hot rays of the sun will melt the wax, destroy the feathered wings and consequently plunge the boy to his death.

The son hears, yet in the exuberance of the experience and in the pride of freedom and life; the son dips, ascends and swoops with unbounded pleasure. Then in foolish pride he challenges the sun, drawing near to its scorching orbit until it is too late. The wax melts, the wings collapse, and he is plunged into the sea to meet his eternal end. And no one notices or cares except the helpless father who desperately shouts out useless warnings and anguished cries as he watches his beloved son fall to his death.

How can we, as frail humans, prevent such a fate for ourselves in our real-life experience? How can we prevent our pride and foolish ways from causing us eternal death?

Jesus gives this advice. (Psalm 39:4 "Show me, Lord, my life's end and the number of my days; let me know how fleeting my life is.") and this warning (Deuteronomy 12:32 "Whatever I command you, you shall be careful to do; you shall not add to nor take away from it."). He gives us this assurance (1 John 5:11 "And this is that testimony: God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son).

In gratitude and confidence, let us remember that our Father God not only provides a way of reliable escape from the imprisonment of sin, but He is also able to save us from our own tendency to destruction. (Isaiah 41:10 "Fear not, for I am with you, be not dismayed, for I am your God, I will strengthen you, I will help you. I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.")

Thank you to all who participated in giving and soliciting for Friendship Home's Safe Quarters drive. Our Piedmont Park Women's Ministries team collected \$1,557.56 to support crisis services and a shelter for families in our community experiencing domestic violence.
